Traditional and emerging methods of dream work that explore common dream themes, nightmares, archetypal images, and the recurring dreams.

Dream Tending arises out of certain philosophical assumptions: that psyche is nature revealing herself in images, that the nature of psyche is inherently multidimensional, and that the images of dreams give form (and body) to the various expressions of psychological life. Dream Tending is based on the premise that images are alive. They are continuously in process and engaged in an imaginal field of relationships, of which we are a part. In the practice of Dream Tending, participants attend mindfully to the particularity of each image—discovering its nature, wondering about its activities, and listening to its experiences.
